

What Do I Do if a Student Discloses They are Being Harmed?

- ◆ React calmly and listen carefully to the student
- ◆ Do not compromise confidentiality. Explain to the student that you will need to pass on the information to the
- ◆ Designated Safeguarding Lead if you are worried about their safety.
- ◆ A copy of the school's Safeguarding Policy is available on the JSTC website. A hard copy can be obtained from the Main Office.

Keeping Yourself Safe

- ◆ Be professional, Be careful how you interact with or speak to a students, the student may interpret it differently.
- ◆ Avoid physical contact with students unless you are preventing them from immediate harming themselves or others.
- ◆ Avoid being on your own with a student, always ensure that a door is open and you are visible to others.
- ◆ Always tell someone if a student touches you or speaks to you inappropriately. Log down the incident time and date and pass it on the Designated Safeguarding Lead.
- ◆ Do not give any personal information to students such as your mobile number or address.
- ◆ Do not give students details of your personal social media accounts or engage in any communication with students on social media.
- ◆ **If in doubt... Please ask.**

Visitors Procedures

- ◆ All visitors must sign in at Main Reception
- ◆ Visitors working 1:1 with a student must have the Enhanced DBS Disclosure.
- ◆ All visitors will be issued with an appropriate pass which must be displayed at all times whilst on site.
- ◆ Visitors wishing to speak to a particular member of staff should contact the school to make an appointment.
- ◆ Visitors must sign out at Main Reception and return their visitors pass before leaving the site.

Health & Safety

Contractors must ensure that they are fully conversant with the safety rules and regulations to be observed by contractors working on site.

As a visitor to our school it is essential that you follow any health and safety guidelines that may apply. By doing so, you will assist us in meeting the requirements of the Health & Safety at Work act 1974

What Do I Do if I am Worried About a Student?

- ◆ If you become concerned about :
Something a child says, marks or bruising on a student, changes in a student's behaviour or demeanour then you must inform the Designated Safeguarding Lead.
- ◆ If you feel that a child may be at risk of harm but are not sure then inform the Designated Safeguarding Lead immediately who will offer advice and take appropriate action.
